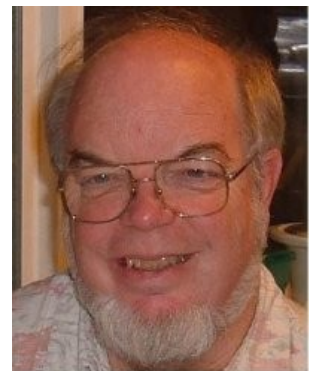

“Genealogy is Fun! Seriously!” by Randy Seaver

Believe it or not, there is a lot of humor in genealogy research – names, epitaphs, wills, cartoons, videos, sayings, poetry, apparel, wisdom, genealogisms, etc. This presentation takes a light-hearted look at the best of the genealogy humor sites and humorous entries in genealogical databases.

Our speaker, Randy Seaver, is a native Chula Vistan. His ancestry is mainly colonial New England and Upper Atlantic, with some colonial German, French and Dutch forebears, and several 19th-century English immigrants. He has been pursuing his elusive ancestors since 1988, and has been online since 1992.

Randy is a former President of the Chula Vista Genealogical Society, and is currently the Newsletter Editor and Research Chair. He speaks to Southern California societies, libraries and groups, teaches "Beginning Computer Genealogy" adult classes at OASIS, and writes the Genealogy 2.0 column for the FGS *FORUM* magazine. He is a member of NGS, NEHGS, SDGS, CGSSD, CVGS and SCGS. Randy blogs daily about genealogy subjects at Genea-Musings (www.geneamusings.com), The Geneaholic (www.Geneaholic.com) and the Chula Vista Genealogy Cafe (<http://CVGenCafe.blogspot.com>).

President's Message by Gary Brock



Happy New Year to all and may you and yours be healthy prosperous and wise in this fresh new year. Each year at this time I like to reflect a little on the year just passed. For many of us, 2011 was a little tough with the financial picture continuing to decline and illness and death taking it's toil. On the other hand, 2011 was fairly kind to our Society.

We started 2011 with 127 members, up from 105 in 2010 and we are ending the year with 113. That's a loss of 11%. Growth is good for a society and in some ways a measure of our effectiveness in the community. But growth is not our only goal. Finding new ways to serve the genealogical and family history needs of the community is a very high priority for us in the year ahead.

We'll be starting with more high quality presenters at our regular meetings on the last Wednesday of each month. For January 25th, our program chair, Virginia Taylor, has arranged for our own Randy Seaver to get us started off on the right foot with a presentation he calls "Genealogy Is Fun! Seriously!" I know you will enjoy this one.

We will be presenting two all-day Saturday seminars again this year. The first, is a paid event on March 31, featuring renowned genealogical speakers, William Dollarhide and Leland Meitzler plus a catered lunch, genealogy book and CD sale and much more. In the fall we will present a free event (*donations accepted*) to celebrate Family History Month which is October and is put on entirely by society members.

Our education chair, Susi Pentico, and her committee, is hard at work developing a series of Saturday workshops to be presented in the Community Room at the Bonita-Sunnyside branch of the county library system, located at 4375 Bonita Road in Bonita. Susi is also planning a set of classes, including beginning genealogy, "Genealogy 101," to be held at either the Civic Center branch or the South branch of the Chula Vista Library.

Ask Gene E. Allogee – Research Tips and Techniques

Question: Where can I find City Directories online over an extended period of time?

Answer: One of the largest collections of City Directories is on the [Fold3.com](http://www.fold3.com) subscription website (formerly Footnote.com). The key feature of this collection is that there are long year to year runs of the directories, often from the first year up to about 1923, when copyright protection kicks in.

Fold3.com currently offers these City Directory collections (not every year, but most years):

- * California: Los Angeles (1873-1924), and San Francisco (1861-1923)
- * Colorado: Denver (1862-1923)
- * Illinois: Chicago (1843-1923)
- * Indiana: Fort Wayne (1861-1923), and Indianapolis (1857-1923)
- * Iowa: Des Moines (1866-1913)
- * Louisiana: New Orleans (1861-1923)
- * Massachusetts: Boston (1789-1926)
- * Minnesota: Minneapolis (1865-1923), and St. Paul (1863-1924)
- * Missouri: Kansas City (1865-1923), and St. Louis (1863-1923)
- * New Jersey: Newark (1861-1923)
- * New York: Brooklyn (1862-1913), Buffalo (1828, 1861-1923), New York (1786-1922), and Rochester (1861-1889)
- * Ohio: Cincinnati (1861-1923), Cleveland (1861-1923), and Toledo (1864-1923)
- * Pennsylvania: Philadelphia (1785-1922), and Pittsburgh (1861-1923)
- * Rhode Island: Providence (1861-1924)
- * Wisconsin: Milwaukee (1861-1891)
- * Miscellaneous City Directories - There are also a few miscellaneous years for some New England towns.

Sharing Files with Dropbox by Dick Eastman

Sending files by email works well for millions of computer owners. However, what do you do if the file is too large for email? A few days ago, I wrote about one possible solution, *Transfer Big Files*, at http://blog.eogn.com/eastmans_online_genealogy/2011/12/transfer-big-files.html. Indeed, that solution works well and I recommend it for sending files to someone else who does not have Dropbox installed and perhaps does not possess the technical knowledge to install and configure Dropbox.

However, millions of computer users do have Dropbox installed, as it is a great file backup and copying program. Most people use it to only share files amongst computers they own, such as copying files from a desktop computer to one's own laptop system or perhaps from the office computer to a home computer. However, Dropbox also has many other uses.

If you want to send one file or even thousands of files to someone else who already has Dropbox installed, there's an easy way to do so. In fact, that person might also update the files and all the new files will be copied to your system(s). I find Dropbox is a great method of sharing genealogy databases with cousins, as long as we are all using the same genealogy program on our Windows or Macintosh systems. I also use it to share family photographs with other relatives who are interested. Hopefully, they will add their own scanned photos to the same shared folder which results in copies of those photos being transferred to my computer.

Macworld Video has created a two-minute video tutorial that shows how to share files with another Dropbox user. It shows how to use Dropbox's free software and cloud storage service. Dropbox also offers extra paid storage, an iOS app, and full folder syncing between Dropbox users. The video is written for Macintosh users but Dropbox is about 99% the same on Windows and about 98% the same on Linux. Any Dropbox user should be able to watch this video and then apply the information to his or her own system, regardless of the operating system. **You can watch the Sharing Files with Dropbox video at <http://youtu.be/NqbBgo96QYw>.**

Here Come the 1940 United States Census Records!

Archives.com announced on 17 November that they will be the partner of the National Archives (NARA) to host the 1940 U.S. Census images. The Archives.com announcement is on the [Archives.com blog](#), titled [Archives.com Partners with the National Archives to Unveil the 1940 Census](#). Archives.com has an information page about the 1940 U.S. Census posted at <http://www.archives.com/1940census>.

Archives.com CEO Matthew Monahan said:

"We are thrilled to have the opportunity to participate in this historic moment and demonstrate our ongoing commitment to the advancement of online genealogy research. Access to 1940 Census records will allow researchers to discover new family members and previously unknown connections to the past. We're happy to have the opportunity to facilitate the discovery of these records, which document over 130 million U.S. residents, more than any previous U.S. Census."

"The 1940 Census will be available to the public April 2, 2012 at 9:00 AM (Eastern Daylight Time) on a new website created in collaboration between Archives.com and the National Archives. The collection will consist of 3.8 million images that the National Archives scanned from over four thousand rolls of microfilm. Public access to the images will not require payment or registration, and will be available to any person with internet access. The name and web address of the website will be announced at a later date.

"Chief Digital Access Strategist for the National Archives Pamela Wright notes, 'The importance of the 1940 Census cannot be underestimated. At the National Archives, we have been preparing for the launch of these records for years. We are working closely with Inflection to ensure researchers will be able to search the 1940 Census when it opens next year.' At launch, researchers will be able to search the 1940 Census by address, Enumeration District (ED), and geographic location. Researchers will be able to browse images by ED number directly, or use address or geographic information to locate the appropriate census schedule."

On 16 December, three leading genealogy organizations, [Archives.com](#), [FamilySearch International](#), and [findmypast.com](#), announced that they are joining forces to launch the [1940 US Census Community Project](#). The ambitious project aims to engage online volunteers to quickly publish a searchable, high quality name index to the 1940 US Census after it is released in April 2012 by the National Archives and Record Administration of the United States (NARA). The highly anticipated 1940 US Census is expected to be the most popular US record collection released to date. Its completion will allow anyone to search the record collection by name for free online. Learn more about this exciting initiative or how to volunteer at www.the1940census.com.

Readers should understand that this announcement addresses only the free access of the public to the 1940 U.S. Census images. There will NOT be an every name index available on 2 April 2012. Several organizations, including Archives.com, FamilySearch, Ancestry.com, and perhaps others, will create an every-name index after the census images are available.

In December, a new 1940 Census tool was added to the Census section of the Steve Morse One-Step website (<http://stevemorse.org>). It's called the Unified 1940 Census ED Finder (<http://stevemorse.org/census/unified.html>). Researchers can use this access tool, and then search the census images on the Archives.com website (or other sites with the images), for the specific census page with their family of interest.
