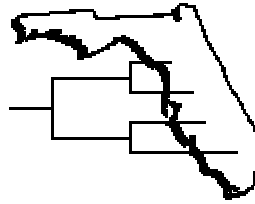

The Florida State Genealogical Society is dedicated to the promotion of excellence in genealogy in our state and support of Florida public libraries. We are pleased, once again, to offer a greater opportunity for the education of librarians who serve genealogical patrons.

For many years, Charlotte Freels Duvall has provided \$200.00 for the librarian scholarship. FSGS adds an additional \$300.00 to make a total of \$500.00 available to any Florida librarian who is serving genealogy patrons. This scholarship is for attending a state or national conference or an institute of genealogical research to help further your education in genealogical research and services.

If your library serves genealogy patrons, we hope we can encourage you to apply for our scholarship and increase your education to better serve your patrons. A copy of our application form is on page 5. It should be returned with a letter of recommendation from your Library Director that includes an assurance that you will be given professional leave to attend the seminar of choice.

The annual conferences and institutes listed here may help you to decide. All of these educational programs provide brochures well in advance. Contact the organization if you would like to be on the mailing list for announcements. There are also many other conferences and instructional courses offered year round.

This scholarship may be applied to the annual FSGS conference and the balance must be applied to one other seminar, conference or institute. You will be required to send a report to the FSGS board after you attend your chosen event.

The scholarship will be presented at the annual FSGS conference, and it is not necessary to attend. The recipient will be notified in advance. Your local genealogical society can help you by giving letters of recommendation and suggestions about which programs are the best to attend.

New Resources

The Florida and Local History department of the Indian River County Main Library in Vero Beach has acquired some new manuscripts and microfilm. These items include:

Walter A. Siewert Fellsmere Collection - Over 1000 photographs about early Fellsmere, ca.1910-1930. In addition to photographs, there are many documents that include information on Fellsmere Sugar Producers Association, Muck Farming, architectural designs and many more documents relating to the history of Fellsmere.

Bruce Smith Postcard Collection on loan for digitization of 600+ postcards and photos about the Indian River County area. It is hoped to have the collection available for viewing on the Internet by the end of this year.

Nelson Fell Family Photograph Album includes numerous scanned images from central Florida. Over 200 photographs and another album is in process of being scanned and it includes photographs from central and northern Florida. This collection came from Jamie Vans of Barnbarroch, a descendant of the Fell family, who lives in England.

In addition, the library was able to purchase Florida microfilm collections from the profit made on the book *U. S. Naval Air Station At Vero Beach During World War II* by George W. Gross and published by the Florida Historical Society. It was prearranged with the author to use all profit for this reason. Below are the new additions.

Working with Scrapbooks in Family Tree Maker (Part Two)

Deleting a Picture in a Scrapbook

1. Open the Scrapbook
2. Click on the picture
3. Click Edit on the Menu Bar
4. Click on Delete Picture/Object

NOTE: *If you remove pictures in a scrapbook, the size of the Family File is not automatically reduced. To reduce the file size, you will need to compact your Family File.*

To compact your current Family File

1. Opening the Family File that you wish to compact.
2. Press Ctrl+Alt+C

Family Tree Maker displays a progress meter while it compacts your file.

Using the More About Picture/Object Window

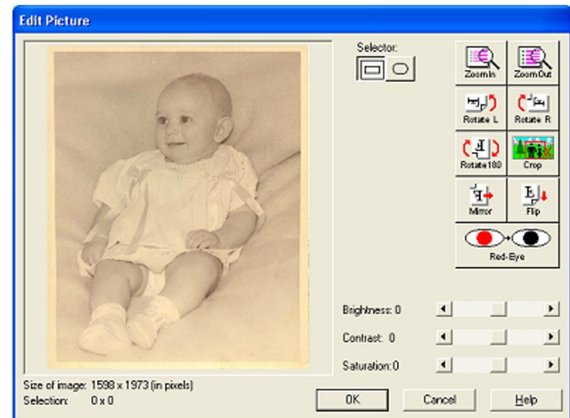
1. Open the Scrapbook
2. Click on the File Cabinet Drawer under the picture
3. The "More About Picture/Object" window will appear.
4. Type in a Caption
5. Press Tab (or click in the next field)
6. Type in a Category
7. Press Tab
8. Type in a Date of Origin
9. Press Tab
10. Type in a Description
11. Make your selects below by clicking in the boxes
12. Click OK.

Editing Pictures in a Scrapbook

1. Open the Scrapbook
2. Click on the picture you wish to edit
3. Click Picture/Object on the Menu Bar
4. Click Edit and you will get a message saying "Your picture will be much better

quality if you get the original before editing it. Would you like to get the original now?"

5. Click on No
6. The Edit Picture window will appear



7. Make your changes using the buttons on the side.
 - a. Zoom In – Zoom Out
 - b. Rotate L – Rotate R
 - c. Rotate 180° - Crop
 - d. Mirror – Flip
 - e. Red Eye
 - f. Brightness
 - g. Contrast
 - h. Saturation
8. Click on OK.

Printing a Scrapbook

1. Open the Scrapbook
 2. Click File
 3. Click on Print Preview
 4. To add a title or page numbers to a Scrapbook:
 5. From the Contents menu, select Title & Footnote.
 6. Create your title and page numbers.
 7. Click OK.
- Family Tree Maker returns you to Scrapbook Print Preview.*
