Lawrenceville Female Seminary

The Female Seminary was incorporated by the General Assembly in 1837, a lot was purchased and a two story brick building erected in 1838. The building still stands.

Daniel Killian erected the seminary building. This gave Lawrenceville two splendid educational institutions. Very few records are available that give any information about the schools.

The Female Seminary was promoted by many of the most prominent citizens of the town and county.

Some years later an effort was made to consolidate the two schools under the name of the Lawrenceville Collegiate Institute.

No records are at hand to show whether the consolidation was consummated or not. In 1851 there was an agreement to sell the lot and building on the first Tuesday of March next. Whether it was sold or not sold remains unknown so far as the records show.
