The last three generations of first sons have been Patrick's and my grandfather died in 1969 (and is buried in Moycullen church), when the Moycullen church was extended in the 50's several family graves were integrated into the church - there are some marble plaques in the church listing those involved in this. There is a second church (ruined) and graveyard in the area, local historians have lists of gravesites, occasionally contested location wise, rarely name wise, contact the local community council office, which is in the village.
