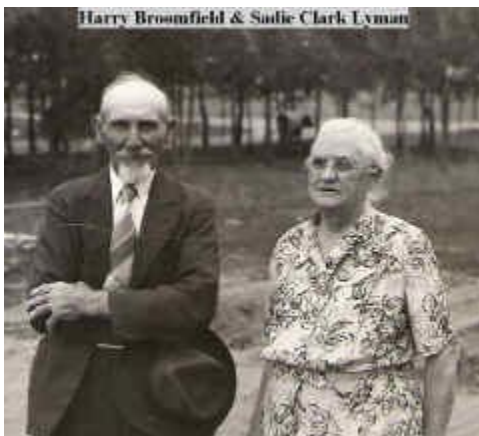

Harry Broomfield Lyman

He married SARAH MAE CLARK 18 Jan 1893, daughter of JOHN CLARK and SARAH MCCRARY. She was born 04 May 1874 in Kansas, and died 29 Aug 1953 in Hutchinson, Kansas.

Notes for HARRY BROOMFIELD LYMAN:

Letter from C.C. Lewis mentions residence in 1880 and says that Mildred Lyman's father (Harry) and Fred lived there but that Frank was in Colorado with Uncle Danford. The letter also mentions his wife's mother "Mother Lyman" and says that Effie was her "only daughter." Fred [Lyman?] and C. C. Lewis got jobs cutting ice on Ash Creek then in February were hired on one of the "Street Gangs" for the Santa Fe Railroad. There were 80-90 men per ganf and they were paid \$1.26 for a ten hour day of work.

Hendershot, 90, formerly of RFD 2, Hutchinson (Kansas), died Feb. 4, 1985, at the Ralph Thorne Health Center at Wesley Towers after a long illness. Born Helen A. Lyman April 21, 1894, in Lincoln Township in Reno County, she married Chester L. Hendershot April 28, 1915, in Darlow Community. He died Dec. 18, 1974. She was a member of South Hutchinson United Methodist Church and charter member of the Lincoln EHU. Notes for CHESTER LYNN HENDERSHOT:

Chester Lynn Hendershot was born February 22, 1893 in Lincoln Township, Reno County, Kansas. He was the oldest of four children born of Andrew Jackson Hendershot (son of Harvey Linn Hendershot & Elizabeth Melvina Shields) and Edna Conah Ellis (Daughter of Peres Ellis & Margaret Reser Ellis), all of Reno County, Kansas. Chester was a farmer and a lifelong resident of the Darlow Community. On April 28, 1915 he was married to Helen Adelia Lyman (daughter of Harry Bloomfield Lyman & Sarah May Clark) also of the Darlow Community. Chester helped organize the Ark Valley Dairy Coop and served on the Board of Directors for the Coop for 25 years. He also served as Reno County Treasurer from 1939 to 1943. He was an active member of the South Hutchinson United Methodist Church. Chester & Helen had 5 sons and 1 daughter: Roger Lyman Hendershot was born February 02, 1916 (married Edna Frances Wall May 24, 1941); Wilbur Ellis Hendershot was born February 21, 1918 (married Winnifred Jean Brock June 07, 1944); Royal Clark Hendershot was born July 14, 1920 (married Lola Mae Davis April 28, 1944); Helen Marie Hendershot was born June 08, 1922 (never married); Maurice Wayne Hendershot was born February 01, 1925 (married Glenna Faye O'Hara August 8, 1949); and Robert Arden Hendershot was born June 06, 1927 (married Beverly Jean Pointon September 23, 1948). Chester died on December 18, 1974 at 3:25 A. M. at the South Hospital in Hutchinson of cerebral thrombosis. His memorial service was held at 2:00 P.M. Saturday, December 21, 1974, at the South Hutchinson United Methodist Church with Rev. Doyle Carroll officiating. Burial was at the Fairview Cemetery, Elmer, Reno County, Kansas. Survivors included his wife; two sisters: Genevieve D. Hendershot (Mrs. Loddie Carter Woolsey of Cleveland, Ohio) and Letha Mae Hendershot (Mrs. Eugene Moore of Cleveland, Ohio); five children; 12 grandchildren; and 5 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a brother, Andrew Ellis Hendershot (born May 12, 1913 died May 16, 1913).

ii. ROBERT C. LYMAN, b. 27 Jun 1898; d. Nov 1983, South Hutchinson, Reno, Kansas.

Notes for ROBERT C. LYMAN: Uncle Bob never married. He bought a farm in Haskell County, Kansas and traveled back and forth between Hutchinson and his farm in western Kansas. In Hutchinson he lived with his parents and then later with his sister Mildred Hemphill. In the Ulysses area he had a trailer placed on the ground he farmed. When he was in his latter 70's he bought a motorcycle he used to get around some on the farm. He kept every car he ever owned and payed cash for the new ones he bought. The ones I remember most are the model A and the 1948 Studebaker. The Studebaker was still driveable when it was sold at auction in the early 1980's. My dad tried to get time off every summer to help uncle Bob with the wheat harvest. It was there that I had my first ride on a combine. I have many letters that were written from Uncle Bob to his sister, aunt Mildred. Most of them are brief reporting the weather, the crop conditions, and when he may be making the trip back to Hutchinson.

Notes for GRACE MILDRED LYMAN: Graduated from Hutchinson Kansas High School in 1922 and Grace Hospital's nurses training in 1929. She worked at Fitzsimmons Hospital, Denver, Colorado; Indian Hospital Service, Lawton, Oklahoma; and Wadsworth Veteran's Hospital in Leavenworth, Kansas where she retired from in the 1940's. She was a member of the Calvary Baptist Church and then Maranatha Baptist Church.
