

Prince George's County, also known as "PG County," was formed by a General Assembly on St. George's Day, April 23, 1696.

The new county was formed from the combination of lands from both Calvert and Charles County. It was named for Prince George of Denmark.

The first people to settle down in Prince George's County were Native Americans, who arrived in Southern Maryland about 10,000 years ago.

The first European who recorded a visit to the area was Captain John Smith, in the year 1608, through the Potomac River.
