WHY SHOULD I JOIN?

From four people gathered in a Franklin County living room in 1976, the MAINE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY has grown to include members dispersed in all 50 states, the Canadian provinces and other countries. Membership in MGS offers numerous benefits for genealogists researching in Maine, New England and eastern Canada.

STATE MEETINGS. At least once each year, usually on a Saturday, members gather at a designated place in Maine to attend seminars that bring to our state some of our region's most widely-known genealogists and others who have expertise to offer us, and to view the displays of vendors who have for sale items of special interest to genealogists. Programs for these Saturday meetings range from organizational workshops, and sessions on regional and ethnic research, to specialized research techniques and tips. There is always something of interest to all genealogists from beginners to the most advanced researchers. Times and dates of state meetings are listed in the *Newsletter* and often in local newspapers as well.

PERIODICALS. *The Maine Genealogist* is the Society's scholarly publication, and is mailed four times a year. It focuses on problem solving articles on Maine families, genealogical methodology, publication of hard-to-find genealogical sources, and critical reviews of new genealogical books and electronic media. Four times a year you will also receive the *Newsletter* with notices of the Society's activities, programs of the Society's chapters and state meetings, and news of the genealogical community.

CHAPTERS. Local chapters of the Society are in the Ellsworth, Brunswick, Farmington, Portland, Waterville, Dover-Foxcroft, Bangor, the County (Caribou) and Belfast areas. Genealogists in these areas are welcome to attend any of their meetings as well as the various state meetings.
