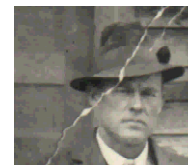



The next guy you see is RENE GAGNON from New Hampshire he was 18 years old when he died. The next guy there was SERGEANT MIKE STRANK he was the oldest of 24. The last guy on the side of the picture is IRA HAYES a Pima Indian from Arizona. Ira Hayes walked off Iwo Jima he went to the White House with James Bradley President Truman told him, "you're a hero". He told reporters, "How can I feel like a hero when 250 of my buddies hit the island with me and only 27 of us walked off alive. Ira Hayes had images of horror in his mind he died drunk, face down at the age of 32...ten years after the picture was taken. The next guy, going around the statue, is FRANKLIN SOUSLEY from Hilltop, Kentucky. Franklin died on Iwo Jima at the age of 19.

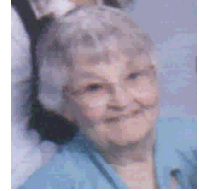
