

****General Requirements for All Entries and Entry Form:****

All art should be two-dimensional only, and may be as small as 8 1/2 x 11" or as large as 11x14." Please mount art on either **white or black paper or cardboard**. The mounting paper should provide a 2-to 4-inch margin top and sides and a 4-to-6-inch margin on the bottom. All works must be the original work of the artist and must not be copied from another photograph, illustration or website, or made by another.

The theme of the contest is "Iron County Courthouse the First 150 Years" and all art must contain a likeness of the courthouse as it appeared at any time between the years 1860 and the present. Early images of the courthouse are available for viewing at the Arcadia Valley Visitors Center & Museum.

NOTE: Entry forms should be mounted securely on the **FRONT** of the art work, centered underneath the art work, on the 4-to-6 -inch margin of the mounting paper.

Student art does not need school sponsorship. Students, grades 9 through 12, of any Iron County school are welcome to enter this contest independently and submit their art directly to the Iron County Historical Society. Home schooled students residing in Iron County are also welcome to enter this contest.

All work must be delivered directly to the Arcadia Valley Visitors Center & Museum on either Saturday, May 8th, 2010 from 10:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. or on Sunday, May 9th from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

IRON COUNTY COURTHOUSE SESQUICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION:

Award winning art work from this competition will be part of a public art exhibit at the Iron County Courthouse Sesquicentennial Celebration to be held in October, 2010. The Celebration is free and open to the public. The works of all student entrants will be on exhibit during from May 10th through June 26th, 2010 at the Arcadia Valley Visitors Center & Museum.

The awards show will be held **Saturday, June 26th, 2010 at 2p.m.**, and will last approximately one-half hour. First, second, and third place winners are asked to be present to receive their awards. All winners will be notified by phone or mail.

Return of Student Art Work:

All non-award winning student art work in the exhibit must be picked up by the student or parents after the Awards ceremony on **June 26th**. **Winning entries will become the property of the Iron County Historical Society and will not be returned.**

Unfortunately, we cannot store any art work beyond that date, unless parents and/or students call and make special arrangements for pickup.

The Iron County Historical Society values every student's art work, and we take great care with each piece. However, we cannot assume any responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, submitted art.
