**NEW STATE SPORTS RECORD ESTABLISHED
ON DECEMBER 16, 2005 BY MISSOURI STATE
HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION**

In 1970, Bill Baker did not receive the full recognition that was due him at that time



when he set two Missouri high school sports records and tied a third record! The Metz High School boys varsity basketball team went to the State playoffs in Rolla, where Bill set a Missouri high school sports record which has not been broken to this day: **BILL BAKER MADE 52 CONSECUTIVE FREE THROWS DURING TOURNAMENT PLAY!** Additionally, he made 194 free throws

in 216 attempts for the 1969-70 season (89.8%) which now ranks number 4 on the MSHSAA's all-time list for a single-season boys performance.

HOWEVER, IN 1969-70, THAT WAS THE BEST SEASON FREE-THROW PERFORMANCE EVER! Bill also tied a third record with others by making 30 points in a playoff game.

Using scorebooks from the 1970 State playoff games, newspaper articles, and other documentation, it has been deter-

mined that Bill Baker's state record in those games has not been broken to this day and the following letter (in part) has been received from the Missouri State High School Activities Association:

"This letter is to confirm receipt of the documentation we received regarding your outstanding free-throw shooting performance and to confirm the placement of these efforts in the All-Time Records of the Missouri State High School Activities Association.

Regarding the 52 consecutive free throws made between February 27 and March 7, 1970, I would like to confirm that this performance is now the official Missouri State High School Record for consecutive free throws made.

As also documented in the materials, you made 194 free throws in 216 attempts for the 1969-70 season (89.8 percent) which ranks no. 4 on the MSHSAA's all-time list for a single-season boys performance. However, at the time you achieved this season mark, it would have been the best season free-throw performance, ever.

The MSHSAA is grateful for the many hours of research by Mr. Robert Seater and the time he has committed to recognizing your performance and in securing their proper place in our State's basketball history.

MISSOURI SPORTS HALL OF FAME

Metz High School is now represented at the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame in Springfield by two 8" x 8" engraved pavers that have been placed in recognition of sports achievement at Metz High School. These

THE METZ BANKING COMPANY CELEBRATES 100 YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

In 1906, the Metz Banking Company was purchased for \$800, the capital was



increased from \$5,000 to \$10,000, and it was changed from a private to a State-chartered bank.

A new brick bank building was constructed in 1907, and the bank celebrated that Fourth of July by moving into its new facility. The stockholders at that time were J. M. Downing, Col. J. G. Hudson, J. P. Allen, T. E. Williams, Chas. Hedden, R. L. Graham, G. M. Smith, E. T. Dye, S. D. Witt, W. F. Long, Jas. Witt, W. Barnhill, M. R. Barnhill, and R. H. Peck.

In 1912, Dr. W. Melick was elected president and Irl D. Hudson, cashier. Irl Hudson served in the Navy during World War I; and following his discharge, he returned to the banking business in Metz where he remained active for about 40 years.

Now, 100 years after that \$800 purchase, the Metz Banking Company has grown substantially and expanded with a branch in



Nevada in 1996. A new building was constructed and the charter was moved to Nevada in 2001.

THE HISTORY OF METZ

If received, the Postmaster will have a postal booth at the Reunion site from 3-7 p.m. on June 3 where you can purchase envelopes, stamps, and postcards and have them cancelled with the commemorative stamp. This is sure to be a collector's item and you may wish to purchase several. The commemorative cancellation will also be available at the Metz Post Office for 30 days following the Reunion. DESTRUCTIVE FIRE

Six Frame Buildings on Main Street
Burned Last Friday Morning

Metz suffered from another destructive fire early last Friday morning, and as a result six frame buildings on the west side of Main street were burned.

The fire broke out in W. M. Hedden's building about 12:45, but what caused it is unknown.

The flames quickly spread to the Ellis hotel on the south and W. H. Catherwood's butcher shop on the north. The Corbin building north, occupied by Elmer Charles as an office, was the next to catch fire, and R. C. Sinclair's restaurant and the old postoffice building were next. Here, by heroic work, the flames were stopped.

Thanks to the efforts of the local genealogy society, a full set of microfilm of *The Metz Times*, May 27, 1904-December 1943 and May 3, 1946-September 16, 1977 can be viewed at the Library during regular hours:
