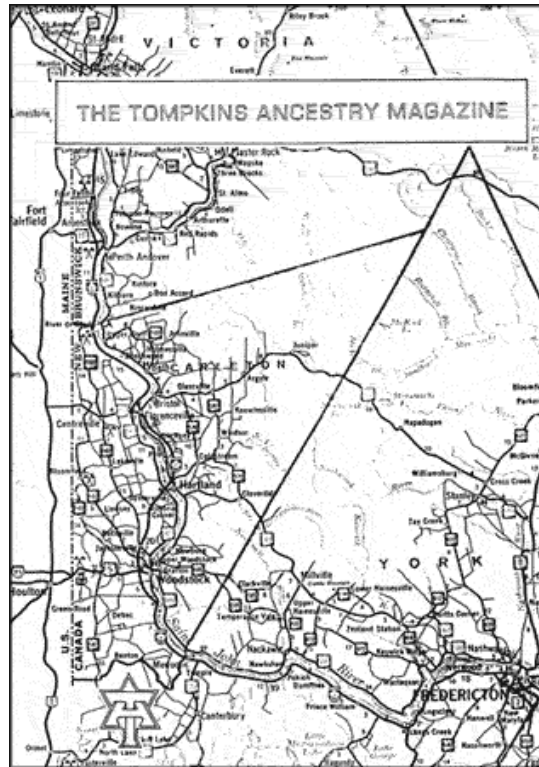

THE TOMPKINS ANCESTRY MAGAZINE

(incorporating THE TOMPKINS FAMILIES OF CARLETON COUNTY, NEW BRUNSWICK).

Welcome to the first issue of the TOMPKINS ANCESTRY MAGAZINE (which we'll refer to as TAM for short}. The major function of TAM is to serve as a vehicle to get information into print about the TOMPKINS FAMILIES OF CARLETON COUNTY, NEW BRUNSWICK (or TFCC for short}. Therefor, the greater proportion of each issue will be devoted to the four Tompkins families which were based in Carleton Co. and which, in time, proliferated and spread across the North American continent and eventually, in one branch at least, across the world to Australia!

In 1977, Stanley Corey of Green Valley, Arizona "published" his detailed TOMPKINS FAMILIES OF CARLETON AND YORK COUNTIES, NEW BRUNSWICK, CANADA. volume contained the results from over 40 years of research into various families (including the Tompkinses in New Brunswick}. Actually, "published" isn't the correct word as the book was not in fact printed in quantity for sale; there were only twenty or so copies of the book made up and most of these were lodged in libraries and research facilities in Canada and the U.S. Those copies may be perused by anyone interested - please ask me if you want to find out where the nearest copy is located in relation to where you are living. I consider myself fortunate to have one of the few copies in private hands and if you happen to be in my neck o' the woods some time, you're welcome to come and peruse. Stanley's purpose I believe was simply to get the results of his research into print and into locations where interested persons could gain access to it. This he has achieved. And I am indebted to Stanley for permission to quote freely from his work in the TFCC sections.

The original publishing plans for the TFCC called for individual volumes for each of the four branches - the families of Edmund, John, Obadiah and Jacob. Each volume was to be complete in itself and to convey all generations up to the present day- I intended starting with my branch - Jacob's descendants. The other three branches would have followed in turn. This presented certain problems - for example, while Jacob's descendants might be pleased with their volume, the members of the other three branches would still be waiting for their turn to come (and one branch would have to be last!). Also, and quite importantly, it is a fact that once information is put into book form, it's virtually impossible to correct or up-date it successfully. Even the issue of corrected editions does nothing to help persons holding copies of the original editions. Therefor, it seems a worth-while exercise to issue copies of TFCC in this loose-leaf format (as part of TAM} so that corrections, additions etc. can be made and replacement pages issued to be substituted for those pages with out-of-date information. It is important to stress that the old replaced pages should be DESTROYED. But we can look at that matter when the time comes to issue replacement pages. For now, you choose how you will store your copy of TAM - in a folder or ring-binder or whatever - just be sure to keep it in such a way that you can insert substitute pages for any found to be in need of correction.

Now, let's have a look at TAM to see how it is made up. There are six sections in this issue, each with its own numbering sequence. The first section is the "magazine" part which is meant to be informal and can cover material not strictly relating to the TFCC. After you've read through pages 1-4 of this issue you'll have an idea of the scope and "informality" of the magazine.

The balance of this issue consists of sections A through E, being the "official" material about the TOMPKINS FAMILIES OF CARLETON COUNTY, NEW BRUNSWICK. Pages A1-A4 cover general information about the four TFCC branches - Edmund (who is designated ET), John (JRT), Obadiah (OT) and Jacob (JT). Pages B1-B10 cover the specific information about the early generations of Edmund's family; pages C1-C8 relate to John's family; pages D1-D4 to Obadiah's family; and pages E1-E8 relate to Jacob's branch. In this issue are listed the original four Loyalists (as set out above) plus the next three generations within each branch. This brings each of the families into this century and should allow any Tompkins descendant to identify his or her own line by finding parents or grandparents listed. Future issues of TAM will add further generations to each of the branches to eventually bring them all up to the present day. And, as already mentioned, replacement pages will be issued to up-date information which is found to be wrong. You are invited to inform me of any corrections needing to be made. Thank you !

You are also invited to contribute items relating to anyone bearing the Tompkins name, famous or infamous - several such items appear in this issue. Material relating to the actual TFCC branches, whether it be in the form of copies of documents, photographs, short biographies of individual TFCC members, maps etc. will be published in section A, except perhaps when there is a full page of material relating to a specific branch, when it will be slotted into the relevant section. Normally though, sections B-E will be reserved for continuing the listing of each branch's descendants. And we'll introduce a section F at some stage to provide a place to print brief listings of families who have close links with the TFCC (these will probably be presented in chart form to clearly illustrate the inter-relationships between the various families). Some that come to mind for possible consideration are the Dows, Hillmans, Boyers and Kinney/Kennys.

It is hoped that the "numbering" system used throughout the TFCC pages (as explained on page A3) will soon prove to be easy to understand. It is a modified version of a genealogical-charting system called the Henry System which normally uses numbers. But it gets complicated/space-consuming when there are more than nine children in a family, so throughout the TFCC listings alphabetic have been used to keep tabs on individual family Members.

 AND NOW IT'S QUESTION TIME!

First, do you recognise the ESPRIT trademark which appears here? Doubtless you've seen it emblazoned across clothing from one end of the nation to the other - worldwide in fact. But did you know that the ESPRIT company has direct links with the TFCC? Well, we are going to tell you just what those links are - in our next issue! That'll give you something to look forward to, won't it? Now for the next question. What is the link between Marilyn Monroe and Jayne Mansfield and the Tompkins name? Don't worry - we won't make you wait for the answer to this one. The common link is the actor known to moviegoers as TOM EWELL, who starred in THE SEVEN YEAR ITCH with MM and in THE GIRL CAN'T HELP IT with JM. Tom Ewell was born Yewell S. Tompkins at Owensboro, Kentucky on April 29, 1909, son of Samuel W. and Martine (Yewell) Tompkins. Tom married Marjorie Sanborn in 1948 and they have one son, Taylor Allen (I don't know whether he uses the Ewell or the Tompkins surname). In addition to appearing in numerous movies, Tom had his own weekly TV show during the 1960's and appeared as Robert Blake's father in the BARETTA series. He recently appeared in a juryroom sequence in an episode of the MURDER, SHE WROTE series.

WHO DISCOVERED THE COMSTOCK LODGE? Most people would quite logically state that a man named Comstock was the discoverer of the Comstock lode, right? Well would you believe that his name was TOMPKINS? Actually, both answers are correct - partly! The prospector who staked out the Comstock Lode was named Henry Tompkins Paige Comstock (1820-1870). So now you know.

The above couple of items would have no place in a publication dealing only with specific Tompkins families (such as the TFCC). However, the flexibility of TAM allows us the freedom to include such items. And in future issues we'll look at more people, real and fictional, sharing the Tompkins name. We'll even look at some towns which have Tompkins in their name. For this issue though, we have just one more such item.

THE ONLY WOMAN COMMISSIONED IN THE CONFEDERATE FORCES WAS A TOMPKINS!
Sally Louisa Tompkins was born in Matthews County, Virginia in 1833. During the Civil War (after the Battle of Bull Run in July, 1861), she founded and operated a hospital for which she supplied the funds and equipment, maintaining it until June, 1865. Known as the Robertson Hospital, it achieved an exemplary record of caring for the wounded. On September 9th, 1861, Sally Tompkins was commissioned as a Captain in the Confederate Army, the only woman ever commissioned in the Confederate forces.

People have occasionally asked me why I bother collecting material about the TFCC branches which don't seem to be related to me? Back in the early days of my research, I collected a lot of material and received help from a lot of people before I was able to define who and what belonged to which branch. So, by the time I could distinguish one branch from another, it just seemed to be a terrible shame to throw away what didn't belong to "my" branch (as my dear friend, Lucy-Ann Ingalls says, "we are all cousins through Adam"). Just think how much work would have been wasted if Stanley Corey had decided to throw out everything he'd collected that didn't prove to belong to his ancestry!!!

The "cover-price" for TAM is nominally \$1.00, but I do not expect my regular correspondents/helpers to pay for their copies; you have already paid in advance through the assistance you have given. But if others care to send along a dollar or so towards the postage costs, I'll be grateful. Thank you.

Every year that passes brings the sad news of the loss of more of our friends and relatives - 1988 has been no exception. During my visit to Woodstock in 1980, I was fortunate to meet two fine gentlemen who have both passed away this year - a cousin, Walter Tompkins, and Earl, husband of my cousin Julia (True) Broad. Both of these men were well-known and respected in Carleton County and will be sadly missed. Walter had his own radio program on radio station CJCJ in Woodstock and was consequently well-known over a much wider area than just the one county. And a second well-known Tompkins has died during the year - Tommy Tompkins, the wildlife photographer. Tommy was descended from the JRT branch. We expect to publish biographies of both Walter and Tommy in future issues of TAM.

But please don't think that we'll only publish anecdotes and biographies about famous Tompkinses - if you have an interesting story to tell about some ancestor or relative, send it along. Also, if you want to advertise for something or someone, we'll run the ad for you free of charge. However, keep in mind that we don't have a regular publishing schedule, so it could take some time for your ad to appear. Perhaps you've lost track of a friend or relative in a distant city - send along the name and old address and maybe one of our readers living nearer to that place can locate the person for you? If you can help with current addresses for any of the above, I'll be obliged.

Mention has been made of keeping TAM in a loose-leaf form to allow for the substitution of replacement pages. In addition, each issue of TAM will carry on the page-numbering sequences in each section. In TAM #1 the pages are numbered 1-4, so in issue #2 the pages will start at 5 and continue on from there. Similarly, section A in this issue runs from A1 to A6 - the next issue will start section A from page A7. This pattern will be followed in all sections. So when a new issue of TAM arrives, you inter-leave the new pages numerically amongst the old and gradually build up a single volume. Any replacement pages will have different dates to the original versions, so it won't be a problem knowing which page to discard - throw away the one with the oldest date.

Finally, some comments about TAM and how it came to get its name. There were numerous quite logical possibilities, such as THE TOMPKINS FAMILY JOURNAL or THE TOMPKINS FAMILY HISTORY MAGAZINE or TOMPKINS TREES and so on. But quite early in the piece, it was decided that we wanted an "A" word to go with the TOMPKINS in the title - ALBUM or ALMANAC or ANNUAL or somesuch - because "T" and "A" can be neatly entwined as a monogram and could therefore become "our" logo (or trademark) - a stylised maple-leaf (see rough sketch below). This struck me as particularly appropriate considering our Canadian connections. And as we all have TOMPKINS ANCESTRY, the choice was easy. Maybe someday we can have little badges made in the form of "our logo" to proclaim our Tompkins heritage?

Let us know what you think of this idea - and tell us what you think of TAM and whether you'd like to see some changes made. We'll look forward to hearing from you.

THE TOMPKINS FAMILIES OF CARLETON COUNTY, NEW BRUNSWICK

GENERAL INFORMATION

PAGE A1 - 12/88

A number of persons named Tompkins, several of whom apparently belonged to the same Loyalist family, went to New Brunswick in 1783-4 and settled along the St. John River above Fredericton. Several of the men, possibly all brothers, had served in the Loyal American Regiment, fighting for the British cause in the Revolutionary War. This family very likely came from Westchester County, New York. John and Roger Tompkins were granted 400 acres of land in 1786 in the present Parish of Southampton. The following year, Edmund, John, Elijah and Obadiah were granted individual lots in the present Parish of Canterbury along the river. These grants were with the lots of the members of the King's American Regiment but the five Tompkinses mentioned here were all in the Loyal American Regiment. The muster rolls of that regiment show that Edmund, John and Obadiah were all sergeants towards the end of the war. Roger was listed as a drummer throughout the war so was probably younger than the others.

Edmund, John and Obadiah all married and had families but no record has been found of marriages for Roger or Elijah. Roger moved upriver with the others and was in the Parish of Wakefield in 1803 when he sold his share of the 1786 grant. Records in the York County Registry of Deeds show that Edmund, John and Obadiah sold their 1787 grants but there seems to be no record that Elijah did the same (possibly he died not long after the grant was made to him?).

In 1802, Charles Turner travelled up the St. John River to do a survey in northern Maine. On September 7th, he got to Meductic Falls, passing a stream called Pokiok, and putting up in the rain at the property of Mr. Edmund Tompkins. Here he saw Edmund's father, aged 106. "He (the father) was a tall man, thin favored, light complexioned, an agreeable countenance, able to walk out and do considerable light labor on the farm; his appetite was good and he slept well. He, with a number of children, attached themselves to the British Army when at New York. Memory had failed, but he kept repeating that his great consolation was that he had been faithful in serving his King." It was John Tompkins, Junior, who had received one of the lots in the 1787 grant, so it is reasonable to assume that the name of Edmund Tompkins' father was John, provided that the Edmund and John in the Loyal American Regiment were brothers.

Members of the family gradually moved up the St. John, from Prince William to Southampton, Northampton and the Woodstock area. The lands they were granted in what was then Woodstock (but is now Canterbury) were rather poor for farming. In a memorial of 1788, Obadiah stated that it was impossible to get a living from his lot. Shortly after 1800, a number of those who had been granted land in the present Parish of Canterbury were located near Florenceville in the present Parish of Peel. Among these were John Tompkins (who had married Abigail Brewer) and his family and Obadiah Tompkins and his family; as mentioned earlier, Roger Tompkins was there also but was alone in 1803. Edmund Tompkins seems to have remained in Northampton Parish.

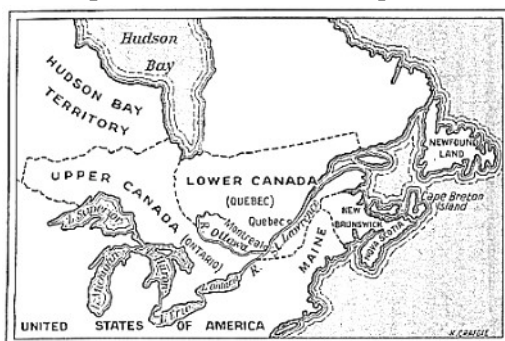

Jacob Tompkins who was in the Prince of Wales American Regiment was certainly not a close relative of the group who served in the Loyal American Regiment. In fact, there is little to suggest that there was any connection at all. Jacob was born in New York around 1759; it seems from circumstantial evidence in various Dutchess Co. (and other) records that his parents were a John Tompkins and Magdalena Lewis, and that he was the only son. It seems very probable though that Jacob had at least two (or more) sisters. One of these was probably the "Sara Tonkins" of Westchester who married "Lodewyk Seyfer" of Poughkeepsie in December, 1770. In the records of the First Reformed Church, Poughkeepsie, N.Y. is listed the marriage of "Casparus Westervelt, widower, to Magdalena Luis, widow of John Thompkins" in 1767. The same records list the baptism in 1777 of "Madgalena, daughter of James Hill and Elizabeth Tomkins witnesses are Jacob Tomkins and Magdalena Westervelt". So this Elizabeth was possibly another of Jacob's sisters. After service in the war, Jacob went to New Brunswick probably with the 1783-4 influx of Loyalists. His name is on a list of, possible grantees of land in Northampton as early as 1785 and he was eventually granted land in that parish in 1796. Jacob's first wife was Mary Place (details of the marriage are unknown) who died in childbirth at Northampton in 1810. Jacob's second wife was Nancy Connor - they married in 1814. She died in 1820 at the age of 31. According to his tombstone in the Kirk Cemetery at Northampton, Jacob died in 1842.

The bulk of the above information about Edmund, John and Obadiah has been condensed from C. Stanley Corey's excellent TOMPKINS FAMILIES OF CARLETON AND YORK COUNTIES, NEW BRUNSWICK, CANADA (privately printed in 1977). Grateful thanks is extended to Stanley for permission to quote from his book. Much of the information found in sections B-E of TFCC is also extracted from Stanley's book, but again, it has been greatly condensed to fit the layout here. Wherever possible, Stanley quoted the sources of his material, provided full dates and named the places where events occurred, listed the parentage of spouses, and all-in-all, gave a full set of facts on each person listed. In addition, he listed persons who might possibly fit into particular families and suggested why those persons most logically could be included in certain branches. None of these "strays" have been included in this issue of TFCC, but a list of them will be printed in a future issue in an attempt to have them identified and assigned their rightful places in the correct branches.

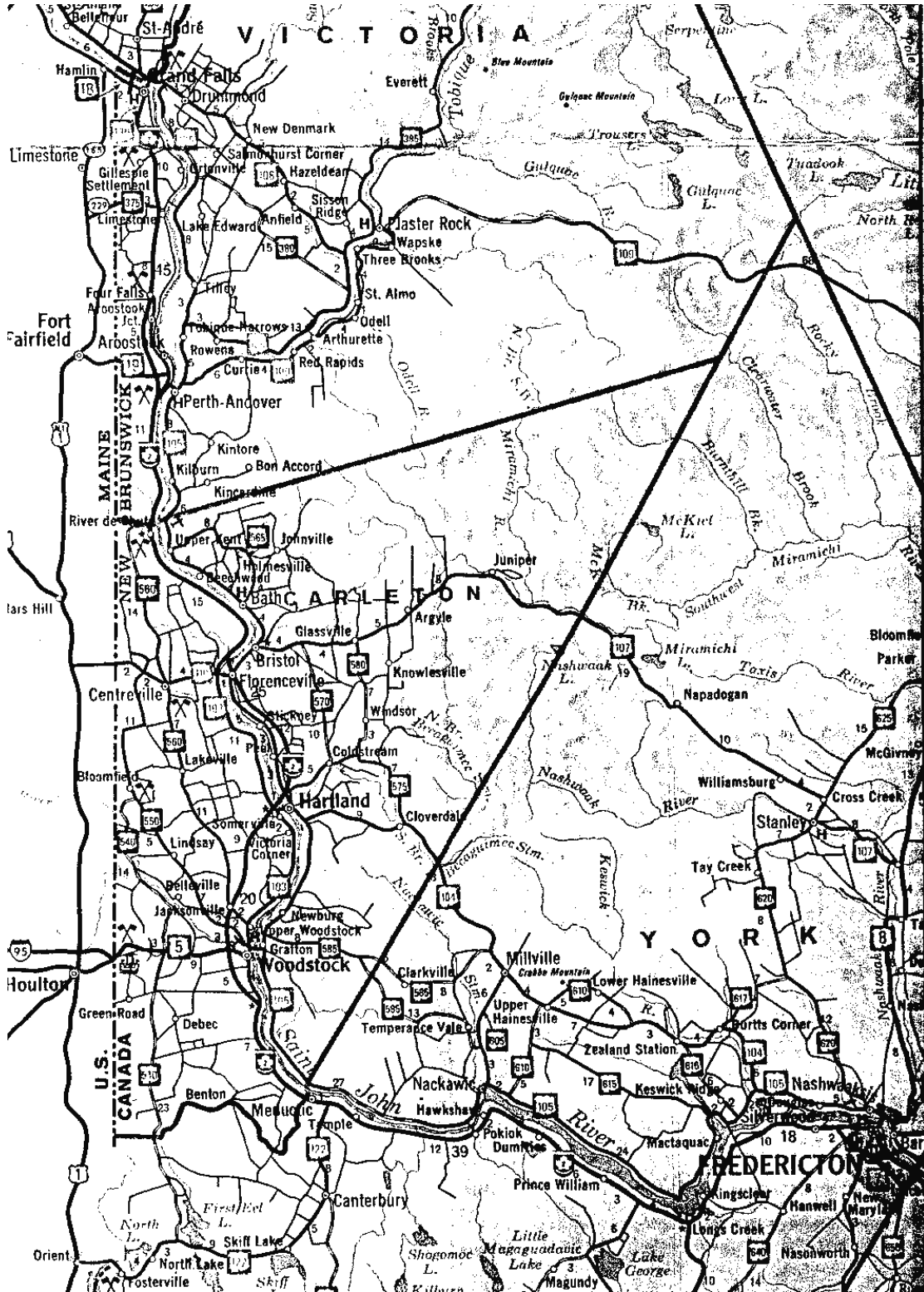
The map below shows the way British North America appeared within ten years



of the arrival of the Loyalists. New Brunswick had been created as a new province from the western half of Nova Scotia. Thomas Carleton became its first governor and the capital was given the name Fredericks Town after the third son of King George III. This name eventually became the Fredericton we know today. Carleton County did not exist until 1832, when it separated from York County, encompassing two of York's original parishes, Woodstock and Northampton. Carleton County presently

has a land area of around 1,300 square miles and the County seat is Woodstock (originally known as The Creek).

For ease of reference, the four branches of the TFCC are identified by the initials of the progenitor of each branch. For example, Jacob Tompkins is JT and the listings of all his descendants are prefixed with the letters JT. ET identifies Edmund, OT is Obadiah and we use JRT for John (whose middle name was probably Roger). An alphabetised version of the Henry System is used to keep track of individuals. Let's take Jacob's branch for explanatory purposes (see page E1). Jacob had 12 or 13 children by his two wives - he of course is designated as JT at the top of the listing. His children are given successive letters of the alphabet according to the known or presumed order of birth - first-born George is A, next born Mary Lettie is B, and so on up to J for the 10th child, Aaron W. The alphabetic sequence continues with the children of Jacob's second marriage - K for the eleventh child and so on. So George is listed as JT/A, Mary Lettie as JT/B and my ancestor William P., the 9th child is JT/I. William's children are in turn listed as JT/IA, JT/IB, JT/IC etc. William's second child, JT/IB, had 7 children by his first wife and they are listed as JT/IBA through to JT/IBG. As a direct descendant of William's second child, my "number" starts with JT/IB. But being three generations further down the line I have three more digits - JT/IBBBC. Working backwards, you can tell that I'm the 3rd child (C) of the 2nd child (B) of the 2nd child (B) of William's 2nd child. My four children are therefore "known" as JT/IBBCA to JT/IBBCD.

Throughout the listings, the use of a slash between two names can either indicate that a person at different times used different names, or that one is the proper name and the other is the nick-name or pet-name the person habitually used, or that two different sources give different names for what is probably the same person. Many of the dates listed have been calculated from census records, marriage certificates, gravestones etc. Therefore, please accept the dates shown as approximations only (which they certainly are in most of the earlier generations). The number shown at the far right of an entry is the number of children of the marriage (or, on a few occasions, of a "liaison"). Where a spouse is known to be a descendant of the same or another of the TFCC branches, that fact is indicated by his/her "number" being listed before the name (as a cross-reference). If you are aware of (or happen to notice) any missing cross-references, please let me know.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

To the great many people who have assisted with information about their own immediate branch, a collective thank-you is given. Two very kind ladies who are no longer with us were of immense help during the early days of my research - Mrs. Cassie McDonald and Mrs. Susie True. And ongoing assistance from Lucy-Ann Ingalls, Alma Speer, Rowena Tompkins and Annie Dyer has been invaluable. I am also indebted to Becky Huffman and Janet Low, both from Utah, for help on the Jacob Tompkins' branch. In addition to Stanley Corey's book, information has been extracted from Ruth Winona Grant's BEL VISO, Dr. Fred Amos' SHARP genealogy, THE BOOK OF DOW (published 1929), Robert A. Tompkins' 1942 volume THE TOMPKINS-TOMPKINS GENEALOGY and ISRAEL KENNY, HIS CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES (published 1944). Regrettably, these last two books contain many instances of persons incorrectly placed into wrong families. It is hoped that the information which has been utilised from these two books is correct. Finally, special thanks to my co-editor for allowing me the time needed away from family matters to attend to family-tree matters.

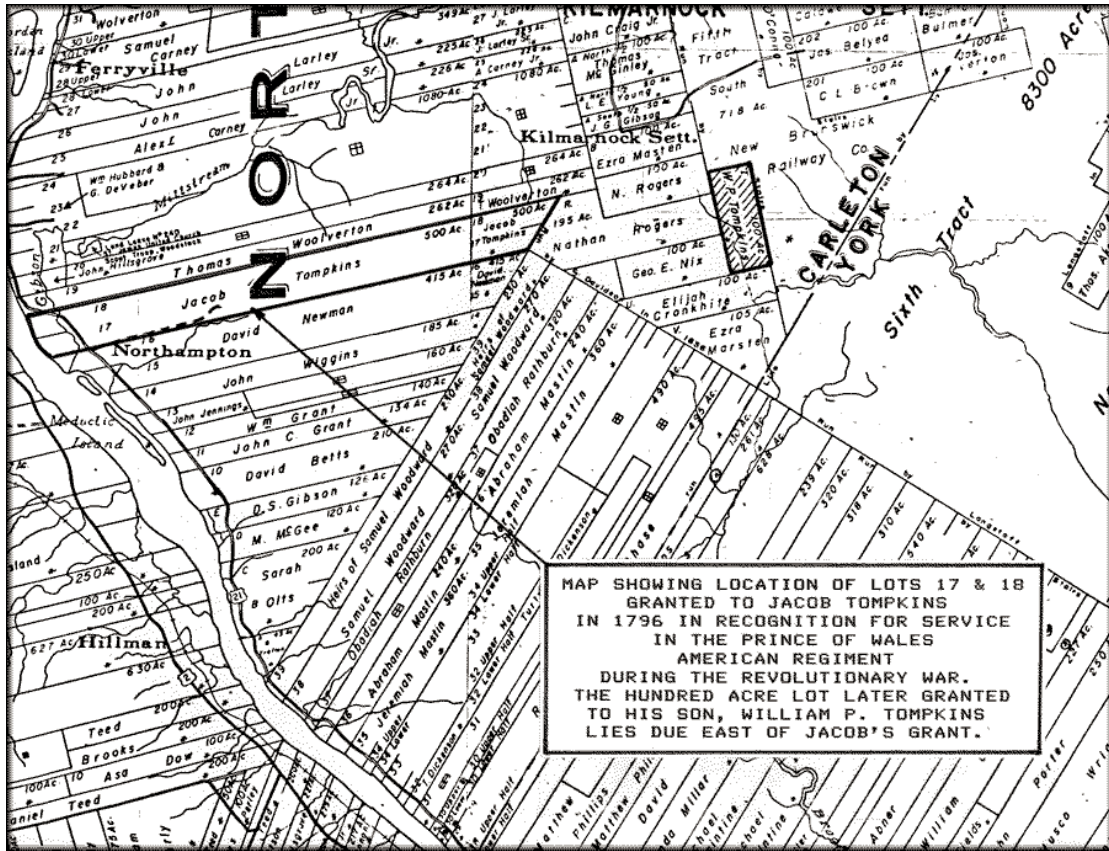
