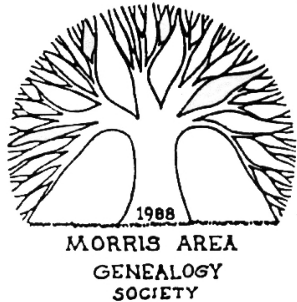

Today there are more choices than ever in choosing software to collect, organize, analyze, display and publish your genealogical research. Larry will discuss the various programs' capabilities to help you choose the one that's right for you and get you started.

Online Genealogy Services: Provided by your library

Services such as Ancestry Library Edition, Heritage Quest, and America's Genealogy Bank are just some of the many on-line services available to the genealogist. Ruth will discuss and demonstrate the services that may be accessed via the Internet through your Library's web site, and can be used by visiting the library.

From Garden State Parkway going North:

Take Exit 142 marked I-78/Springfield/Newark Airport. Must use far right-hand tollbooths. Take I-78 East for ½ mile to Exit 54 marked Hillside/Irvington. Follow signs at exit to I-78 West and Hillside. You will cloverleaf over I-78 and back onto I-78 going west.

- * Follow I-78 West (use local lanes, not express lanes) to Exit 48 marked Springfield/Morristown/24 and 124 West.
- * Follow Rt. 24 West about 2.5 miles to Exit 7B-A. Short Hills Mall will appear on right immediately before the exit. Stay in right-hand lane to avoid missing the exit. Follow signs to Rt. 124 West and Chatham.
- * Once you have entered Chatham, proceed to fourth traffic light at Fairmount Avenue. Continue on Main Street approximately 0.5 miles to United Methodist Church on right.

Entrance driveway is just past the church, on the right. Ample parking behind the Middle School.

From Garden State Parkway going South:

Take Exit 142 marked I-78 West. Follow directions from asterisk (*) above.

From New Jersey Turnpike going North or South:

Take Exit 14 marked Newark Airport. Follow signs to I-78 West. Follow directions from asterisk (*) above.

From I-287 going North towards Morristown:

Take Exit 35 marked 124/South Street/Madison Avenue/Morristown. At end of exit ramp at traffic light, turn left onto South Street (following signs to Rt. 124). At next traffic light, turn right onto Rt. 124/Madison Avenue.

- ** Follow Madison Avenue/Rt. 124 approximately 3 miles into the town of Madison. Landmarks you will pass are: Rod's 1890's Ranch House restaurant on left; Giralda Farms office park on right; Drew University on right. Shortly after passing the main gate of Drew University, the road will curve left and go under a railroad overpass into downtown Madison.
- .
- ** Continue on Main Street/Rt. 124 thru Madison about 2 miles from railroad overpass into Chatham. The United Methodist Church is on the left.

Entrance driveway is just before the church, on the left.

From I-287 going South towards Morristown:

Take Exit 35 marked Madison Avenue/124. At end of exit ramp turn left onto Rt. 124/Madison Avenue. Follow directions from double asterisk (**) above.
