

JROTC / JROTC Contest

The SAR ROTC/JROTC medal to foster the principle of the "citizen-soldier," exemplified by the Minutemen of the Revolutionary War. Awards are presented to cadets who are selected for having a high degree of merit with respect to leadership.



Power Point Competition

The purpose of this new and innovative contest is to offer students an alternative to the traditional essay and oration contests by utilizing the technology component typically taught in all schools.

Requirements include:

- The theme must relate to a person, event, philosophy, or an ideal associated with the American Revolution, the Declaration of Independence, or the United States Constitution.
- The presentation must be between 12 and 15 slides. (The last slide must be a bibliography)
- The presentation must reflect appropriate research.
- The presentation must include sound, pictures, & graphics to enhance the overall impact.

Knight Essay Contest

The Knight Essay Contest is open to all students who are United States citizens or legal aliens. Contestants shall be in the 10th, 11th or 12th grades during the contest year. The contest will be conducted in three phases; local, state and National. The topic of the essay shall deal with : an event, person, philosophy, or ideal associated with the American Revolution, the Declaration of Independence, or the framing of the United States Constitution. Five references are required with a length of between 800 –1000 words.

D. G. High Oration Contest

Our oration contest was founded in 1945 by a member of the Cincinnati Chapter of the SAR. Chapter winners compete at the state level. The National SAR also sponsors a national oration event called the Rumbaugh Oration Contest. The purpose of the contest is to draw an intelligent relationship between the past & the present and to illustrate how the Revolutionary War influenced our freedom of expression.

Howard Miller Flag Collection

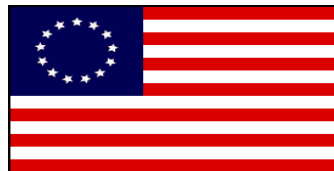

Our color guard consists of members of the Sons of the American Revolution, outfitted with Revolutionary War era uniforms and muskets. They are available to post the National Colors or for the Pledge of Allegiance Anthem at your meeting or event. A musket salute can be provided, depending on the event. Community participation includes: grave marking ceremonies, meetings, school American History programs, luncheons, and sporting events.



Good Citizenship Program

The purpose of this award is to recognize students who have exhibited consistent qualities of good citizenship. In previous years, over 800 certificates have been mailed out to over 121 area schools. Information is sent out to area schools each spring with ample time for inclusion into spring honor's programs. Teachers are asked to select students who are deserving of this suitable for framing award. The criteria includes: dependability, cooperation, leadership, patriotism, and cleanliness of speech and habit.

Eagle Scout Program

- The Eagle Scout Awards Program is open to all Eagle Scouts who are currently registered in an active unit and have not reached their 19th birthday. College plans do not need to be completed in order to receive the cash scholarship. The contest is judged on the local, state, and National level with the winners receiving:
- National 1st Place —\$8000. , National 2nd Place—\$4000. & National 3rd Place—\$2000. The application consists of : a 500 word essay, a four generation ancestor chart, & a two page application form.
