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## What Happened at the April Meeting?

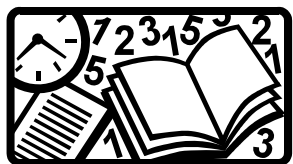
Twenty-six members and guests signed the guest book at the April meeting of SCCOGS.

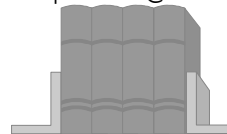

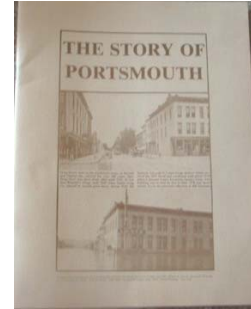

## The Story Tellers.....

We are the chosen.

My feelings are, in each family there is one who seems called to find the ancestors. To put flesh on their bones and make them live again, to tell the family story and to feel that somehow they know and approve.

To me, doing genealogy is not a cold gathering of facts but, instead, breathing life into all who have gone before.

We are the story tellers of the tribe. All tribes have one. We have been called, as it were, by our genes. Those who have gone before cry out to us: Tell our story. So, we do. In finding them, we somehow find ourselves.

How many graves have I stood before now and cried? I have lost count. How many times have I told the ancestors, "You have a wonderful family, you would be proud of us?" How many times have I walked up to a grave and felt somehow there was love there for me? I cannot say.

It goes beyond just documenting facts. It goes to who am I and why do I do the things I do? It goes to seeing a cemetery about to be lost forever to weeds and indifference and saying I can't let this happen. The bones here are bones of my bone and flesh of my flesh. It goes to doing something about it. It goes to pride in what our ancestors were able to accomplish. How they contributed to what we are today. It goes to respecting their hardships and losses, their never giving in or giving up, their resoluteness to go on and build a life for their family. It goes to deep pride that they fought to make and keep us a Nation. It goes to a deep and immense understanding that they were doing it for us. That we might be born who we are. That we might remember them.

So we do with love and caring and scribing each fact of their existence, because we are them and they are us. (For we without them cannot be made perfect.)

So, as a scribe called, I tell the story of my family. It is up to that one called in the next generation to answer the call and take their place in the long line of family storytellers.

That, is why I do my family genealogy, and that is what calls those young and old to step up and put flesh on the bones.

## OGS Reviews SCCOGS Publications

The following reviews were printed in the Ohio Genealogical Society Quarterly, Vol. 44, No. 1 in March 2004:

**Gravestone Inscriptions from Greenlawn Cemetery, Vol. I & II. (CD-Rom).** Greenlawn Cemetery contains earlier burials from the 1820's, but no records exist before the 1870's due to a fire at the office at that time. This CD-ROM contains two volumes, those burials before 1900 in Volume I and those after 1900 in Volume II. Because of the difficulty in reading older stones, a comparison was made with a list compiled over thirty years ago. The information is available in several formats including Word. You may search for a particular name or browse the entire database. The information is arranged as the grave stones were read so proximity of stones is apparent. This is a valuable tool for Scioto County researchers. (Carol Noe Guzzo)

**Early Settlers of Scioto County, Ohio** in honor of the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the County of Scioto, the City of Portsmouth, and the State of Ohio. Compiled by the Scioto County Chapter Ohio Genealogical Society, PO Box 812, Portsmouth, OH 45662. This work has four sections and an every name index. The first section consists of descendant charts and family group sheets with some narratives submitted by members or others who are descended from early residents of Scioto County. A few have documentation for the facts presented. Each has the name of the person who prepared the submission. The second part is a list of the surnames that appeared on the 1820 and 1830 federal census of Scioto County. The third part is a list of biographies of early citizens which appeared in a book *Pioneers of Scioto County* by James Keyes. The fourth section consists of a listing of the proven ancestors of Scioto County awarded certificates of authenticity by the Scioto Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society. Researchers of early Scioto County, Ohio, will wish to consult this volume for clues. (Carol Noe Guzzo)
