

## **CALVIN BRUMMETT**

**I would dearly love to have a picture of Calvin Brummett, my great-great grandfather. I know that his wife Anna Beeler died in 1885 in Vernon, MO. They had married the 10<sup>th</sup> of March 1842 in Clinton, Anderson Co. TN.**

**Calvin's obituary is the only written information I have about him. It appeared in the Sedalia Democrat Newspaper Sunday July 21, 1912 as was as follows:**

### **AGED MAN DEAD**

**CALVIN BRUMMETT, nearly 93 years of age, passed away Saturday morning.**

### **FOUGHT BY THE SIDE OF SON**

**Both belonged to the same Federal Company in the Strife, Between the States- Deceased Had Lived in MO over 50 years**

**Calvin Brummett, aged almost 93 years, and a resident of MO for over a period of fifty years, died Saturday morning at 11 o'clock at the home of his son, Daniel Brummett 1620 South Carr Avenue, death being due to general disability.**

**Mr. Brummett had been enjoying fairly good health for a man who had almost reached the century mark in life's journey. Last Tuesday he began weakening and his system suffered a general break down. Although he was not afflicted with illness, his condition was such that he gradually grew weaker until the end.**

**The deceased was born in Anderson County, in East Tennessee Nov. 15, 1819 and in 1857 moved to MO, locating in Vernon Co., where he resided for several years. He served in the Federal army in the Civil War under the command of General Sanford, of the Seventh Missouri, which was stationed a portion of the time at Springfield. Mr. Brummett served with his son Daniel Brummett and they participated in several important engagements, among them being the Battle of Wilson Creek, which was one of the most important engagements in MO during the entire war.**

**At the close of the war, and in the spring of 1866 Mr. Brummett with his family, came to Pettis County and he was actively engaged in farming until about 20 years ago, when he retired on account of advanced age.**

**Mr. Brummett was a member of the Methodist Church, and was the father of eleven children seven of whom survive him. His wife died several years ago. The surviving children are: Daniel and Winfield S. Brummett of Sedalia; Mrs. Mary J. Wilson, Vernon County, MO. Q.L. Brummett of Mars, North Dakota; Henry and Melvin C. Brummett of Gas, Kansas; Samuel H. Brummett of Longwood. The remains will be taken this afternoon on Katy Limited No. 9 to Milo, MO in Vernon County, where the funeral will be held Monday and at which place**

**interment will be made.**
