Family History Tips

Another way to save an off-site copy of your PAF backup is to get a free email account with a dependable web-based provider with the ability to store and easily search archived emails online (i.e. gmail or yahoo). Then create your backup, attach it to an email and send it to yourself. If you ever need to restore the backup, log in to your email account, search the archive for the email message and download the attachment, then restore it in PAF.

Questions/Answers



QUESTION: I have 2nd cousins once removed marrying 7 or 8 generations back and I'm not sure how to handle them as I continue my pedigree chart and family group books. Should I duplicate all the information or is there a better, more approved way of handling this

situation.

ANSWER: Enter the individuals in your database only ONCE making the needed relationship links. Pedigree charts will print the information as is the first time, then when it comes up the second time, simply print a message referring you to the first printing to see the continuation of the line. You can do the same in your family group books, rather than duplicating everything.

QUESTION: To what extent does a person's "jurisdiction" extend? I know that you're responsible for your own ancestors, but are you also responsible to get the information and do the temple work for, say, the siblings of direct ancestors? If so, do you include their sibling's children? If so, do you stop there? Pretty soon you wind up with distant cousins who aren't technically your ancestors at all, but you did find the info. Are we supposed to include them? Are there rules for/against that? Do we need to get permission from directly related individuals to submit those or others we are not directly related to?

ANSWER: There is an excellent article in this month's Ensign magazine, "Branching Out on Your Family Tree," (Ensign, Apr 2007, pgs 44-47), by George D. Durrant. He quotes President Packer saying (1994) "Members of the Church as individuals and families are responsible to identify their own direct-line ancestral families and see that temple ordinances are performed for them. **They may also do family history research and temple work for their deceased relatives who are collaterally related.**" Brother Durrant also stressed, "We should, however, be sensitive to the feelings of others and **obtain permission from the closest living relative when submitting the names of deceased persons who were born within the last 95 years.**"
