Family History Tips



PAF shortcuts to multiple databases - A question from a local PAF user led me to a method that I now prefer. She had just bought a new computer and wanted two PAF icons on her desktop. One would open only to her genealogy and the other to her husband's. I did not know how to accomplish this so I

inquired of PAF support. The solution relies upon a capability of Windows. Use Windows explorer to find the database you want to open. Place the cursor on the name of that file and click the RIGHT mouse button. Select "Create shortcut". Rename the shortcut to the name of that database. Move the newly created shortcut to the desktop. When you click on that shortcut Windows will read the extension and compare it to its list of programs and extensions. It will then use the PAF program to open that database. It works perfectly for me! ---Richard L. Halliday, PAF-5 Users

Questions/Answers



Question: In 2006, I located the name of an ancestor and checked to see if temple ordinances had been done for her. The baptism was completed in January 2006, and the endowment and sealing to parents listed "cleared." Now, two years later, those two ordinances are still listed as "cleared." Is it okay to resubmit her name for these ordinances so I can make sure they are done? Is there a certain length of time I should wait?

Answer: Taken from Church Support Knowledge Document ID: 5330m_en: "The word "Cleared" in the ordinance areas of the International Genealogical Index means that the individual's information has been submitted to the temple but no ordinance date is yet available. The term "In Process", which you may see in TempleReady or the International Genealogical Index on CD Rom, means the same thing. **Do not resubmit these names for temple ordinance work.**"

There is no time limit suggested. It simply says Do Not Resubmit.
