Family History Ward Antique Road Show - We invited members of the ward to a Family History Antique Road Show. Members who wanted to display an item provided the Family History Consultants with the "story" behind their precious antique which was typed up on display cards and available to

display with the item the evening of the event. Items displayed included, art, furniture, toys, clothing, photos, special baking items, jewelry, farm equipment etc. Participants displayed their items around the perimeter of the room and as people arrived they were able to view the displays. We served a dinner of buffalo stew and cheese biscuits, and for our program drew names from a hat of everyone who had

displayed an item and those individuals whose names were drawn shared the story of their antique, photo etc. and the family history. We drew about 10 names. Half way through the presentations we had a sing a long, with European, and US old time favorites. (we projected the words to the songs so everyone could join in). One participant commented that it was really great to have such a meaningful activity. -- submitted by Teri Chase-Dunn

Scrapbook/Journal - Turn your journal into a scrapbook. On one page, paste in pictures, ticket stubs, notes, small scraps of paper or anything else that has some sentimental value. Then on the next page, write about the particular memory associated with those items. For example, maybe you and your child went to a baseball game. Paste in pictures of the two of you at the game along with your ticket stubs and/or scorecard. Then write about the day the two of you shared. Family History and Temple work is all about the "One."

Sister Westra shares a lesson she learned from a counselor in her stake presidency:

"I have remembered his words for 27 years now and they have affected how I have lived my life ever since."

"It happened in a Welfare meeting for leaders in the wards of our stake. The Stake President's Counselor, Max Jackman, was conducting. He went around the circle, asking each bishop in turn, what they were doing to help the members in his particular ward. Each gave answers about the committees they had formed, the classes and lessons they were teaching, the food storage demos, the talks in Sacrament meeting on the topic, the handouts prepared and distributed, etc. Then President Jackman said these memorable words, 'That is all well and good.....but what I really want to know is.....**Who.....by name.....have you ACTUALLY helped?'**"

"As we work with our ward members one-on-one in their homes and in the family history center, and think about our deceased ancestors, let us remember those words: **Who....by name...have we actually helped?'**"
