Discover what indexes and records you can use online - More and more information is becoming available online (either free or fee-based), which can save a trip to the library. In some

cases, the actual records you wish to use may not be online, but even if indexes to those records are online, you can save time by doing a little digging at home first and then making more effective use of your on-site time.
