

BOUNTY LAND WARRANT No. 27.289 - for service rendered during the War of 1812

Pursuant to an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to allow further time to complete the issuing and locating of Military Land Warrants during the late War," approved January 27th, 1835, and an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for satisfying claims for bounty land for military services in the late war with Great Britain, and for other purposes," approved July 27th, 1842,

William, James, John, Martha and Mary Criddle, the children and only heirs at law of James Cridill, alias Criddle,

late a Private in the company commanded by Captain Hay's of the Twentieth Regiment United States Infantry and is entitled to One Hundred and Sixty Acres of Land, to be located as is provided for under the first section of the aforementioned Act, approved July 27th, 1842, and this Warrant shall not be assignable to any person whatever.

Given at the Department of War this Fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-four
