Today while prowling the Legacy Users Group archives of their postings, (I am not signed on now as there are just tooooooo many that come in daily, so I just review the archives weekly), and found this little unknown, to some of us, tool. This would help when you have downloaded one of those Census images in PDF format and are having troubles reading it.

You can set the magnification level anywhere from 1 to 10 and you can reverse the coloring which in some cases might help.

The screen will pop up at the top of whatever you are viewing and you can pull down the top bar on that image if you want more of it to be magnified.

I also have now created a shortcut on my desktop for quickly getting to it in the future.

Start, All Programs, Accessories, Accessibility, Magnifier If it isn't there, you may have to install a "Windows component"
