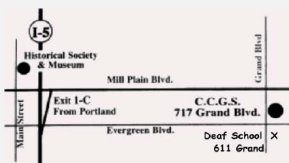

This is a result that we were working for and it came in big time! Wouldn't it be great if all obits were as easy to request!

The **cumulative territory censuses** for Clark County are finally printed. If you have Clark County people before 1900, these may be a help. They should be on line at the state, but it may be more convenient to come down and get a hard copy at CCGS. Thank you Anita Roberts.

The **Indian Census** project for the state is being completed. It was a hard one to do – figuring out the phonetically spelled Indian names that varied from year to year. The English names were fairly straight forward, but it still took a lot of time. The first of the batch were sent to the state in late September and another batch will be on its way soon. Bea Hicks bravely took on a segment as did Steve Connick. Dixie Arata and Amy Singer tried to proof one series but the Indian names were complex. Those still working on the census are Diana Manning, D Becker, DeAnn Wilson, and Jane Germann.

Don and Sharon Houck should complete the **Clark County map index** for 1928-9 soon – this does not contain city of Vancouver people, but should help with finding out-lying people on the 1932 census, which has not been indexed for Washington state. Thanks for doing this job.

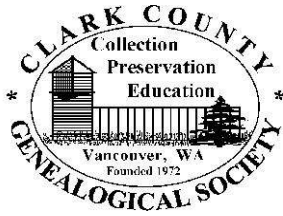
