FRED L. HOLMBERG

Killed When Jet Plunges Into Sea

Lt. (Senior grade) Frederick L. Holmberg, former resident of Fishers and a Camas high school graduate, was reported killed at sea when the jet fighter plane he was flying crashed near the island of

Formosa in the Pacific.

The Navy department reported he was flying from the carrier USS Yorktown when the crash occurred. **The body has not been recovered.**

Lt. Holmberg was born in 1923 in Tacoma and moved to this area before entering school. He attended Camas schools and after graduation enlisted in the Navy air corps, serving as a Navy dive bomber pilot during World War II.

After his World War II service he joined Crown Zellerbach and remained there until March 1952, when he was recalled to service for the Korean War. He served aboard the USS Princeton in Korean waters, earning two air medals and five gold stars in lieu of additional air medals for valor.

The crash was reported to have occurred Sept. 19, but official notification was held up until his fate was officially determined.

This was the third Camas man to be killed this year in airplane crashes connected with military duty. In April Daniel McPherson died in a crash in California and in August the life of Dean McKeever was claimed in a South Dakota crash. Both of these men were with the Air Force.

Lt. Holmberg is survived by his mother, Mrs. Thomas Holmberg, 310 27th, Vancouver, two sisters, Miss Dorothy Holmberg of Vancouver and Mrs. Fred Schlegel of Camas; and a brother Edwin Holmberg, Vancouver.

**ROBERT C. PRINDLE,
Pioneer, Passes**

Robert Collier Prindle, pioneer for whom the community of Prindle east of Washougal was named died there Oct. 22 at the age of 76.

Mr. Prindle, a fruit grower and merchant, moved to Washington with his parents at the age of five and spent the remainder of his life at the location which bears his name. He was born June 30, 1878

in Chicago.

In 1907 he was married to Louise A. Wallauer and they had one daughter Beryl Prindle Montchalin, a Reed college graduate, who preceded him in death in 1949.

He took over the Prindle store from his father and operated it for 36 years. He was postmaster there until the post office was closed in 1940. The property there has been in the Prindle name for 71 years. In 1908 his father, delighted to have the train come through the settlement, donated the right of way through their holdings. Because of this the station was named Prindle.

Robert Prindle's high school education was completed in Vancouver and he went to and from Prindle on weekends by boat. He was the first county horticultural inspector and was instrumental in starting the orchards at Underwood. He used to market his fruit by sailboat across the Columbia to Bridal Vail. He worked on the U.S. Geodetic survey in the early days.

He was a member of the elks club in Vancouver.

He is survived by his wife Louise, of Prindle, and a nephew, Gilbert R. Jeffcott, Washougal.
