

Descendants of Samuel Mason Tucker

Generation No. 1

1. Samuel Mason¹ Tucker¹ was born Abt. 1818 in Maine, parents names are unknown.², and died 16 Apr 1870 in Milwaukee, WI - National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, however he is not buried there. He is listed as being buried at Forest Home Cemetery.. He married **Julia A. Delaney³** 07 May 1844 in Parishville, St. Lawrence Co. N.Y., daughter of James Delaney and Mary. She was born 07 Mar 1826 in Paris, France, according to her obituary., and died 18 Nov 1904 in New Lisbon, WI. There is no verification of her birth in Paris. Her sister, Angeline, is listed as being born in New York on July 4, 1818.⁴

Notes for Samuel Mason Tucker:

A personal 2004 note from KLW:

My research of the Tucker/Martin family history began about 1991. Tucker cousins (Shirley, Clay, Ralph, Adoree, Sally, Phyllis, Beth) have shared family data and photos. Many great RAOGK volunteers have been wonderful (especially Amelia & Christine) for searching and finding requested family information. Jackie Hufschmid and Rose Clark have also been so helpful in providing data. If any interested descendants of Samuel & Julia (Delaney) Tucker would like to contribute more data or corrections, please contact me. Samuel's parent's names are presently unknown. So, the history starts in 1844 with the marriage of Samuel & Julia in Parishville, St. Lawrence Co., N.Y. Julia's Widow's Claim for Pension papers provided a wealth of facts in affidavits for disability, proof of marriage and births of children. Francis Wm. Tucker's letters are great reading with stories of life in the 1880's in Wisconsin and travels to the West. These letters also provided leads to finding more information about Francis and his two daughters, Laura & Cora Lee.

September 2006: I was contacted by Rick, another Tucker descendant. He graciously shared a 1906 or 1907 picture of Charles Samuel Tucker's family which his grandmother, Ellen, is in possession of. I'm still searching for pictures of Marietta, Almeda and Francis.

The 1850 NY Federal Census, County of Oswego, township of Scriba lists on page 389, image 272, Samuel Tucker, 30, farmer, place of birth as not known, Julia Tucker, 26, pob not known, Mary E Tucker, 5 b. NY and George H. 1/12, b. NY.

State Historical Society of Wisconsin Certificate of Service

This is to certify, that records in the state archives show that

SAMUEL TUCKER,

late a Private in Co. A, 31st Regiment of Wisconsin Infantry Volunteers was enlisted into military service on the 4th day of August, 1862 by Captain Chase at Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, for the term of three years and was mustered into the military service of the United States on the 9th day of October, 1862, by Major Smith at Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin. At the time of his enlistment, Private Tucker's place of birth was not given. He gave his residence as the Town of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, WI.

Private Tucker was on furlough from September 8, 1863 to October 8, 1863. He was on detached service at the post bakery in Murfreesboro, Tennessee from November 1863 to March 1864. He mustered out of the service on July 29, 1865.

The records further show that said soldier when enlisted was 44 years of age, had blue eyes, light hair, a light complexion and was 5 feet 10 1/2 inches in height , and by occupation was a farmer. He was wounded August 4th 1864 and admitted August 8 to General Field Hospital, Chattanooga, Tenn. He had a gunshot fracture of the lower jaw.

Samuel died at the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers (DVS). He arrived April 13, 1870 and was there temporarily. He died at the hospital April 16, 1870 of Consumption. He was not buried at Wood, WI, but is listed as being interred in Forest Home Cemetery. January 30, 2001 - Note: Clay Jacobson, grandson of Edna Tucker, called Forest Home Cemetery and verified that Samuel was buried there in Lot 3, Block 16, Section 31, Grave 49. He applied for a grave marker and that was placed on Samuel's grave March 2001.

Samuel is listed as Mason Samuel Tucker in LDS's IGA Index. Samuel & Julia's marriage is also listed and the children Marietta, George, Charles, Frances, & Amelia. This information was submitted to the Atlanta temple by unknown source in Sept 1991. The film contains no other information.

Since there is no information on Samuel's parents names, following the naming patterns in England listed below, possibly his father's name was George Henry and his mother's name may have been Sarah or Ann or Sarah Ann. Charles Samuel must have been named after Samuel and Francis William may have been named after Samuel's eldest brother.

1st son -- Father's father

2nd son -- Mother's father

3rd son -- Father

Younger children would be named after earlier ancestors, but the pattern in their case was more varied.

Notes for Julia A. Delaney:

The naming pattern in England, 1700 - 1875 listed under Samuel presents the idea that possibly Julia's full name was Julia Augusta Delaney. We know Julia's mother's name was Mary (listed on her death certificate) and their first daughter, Maryette, was more than likely named after her. Julia's father's name was James, but maybe Augustus was also part of his name. Almeda Lodoska and Angelina Sivilie were probably Julia's sister's names.

Julia's Widow's Claim for Pension was filed April 22, 1871 as a resident of Orange in the County of Juneau and was accepted for approval December 24, 1886. She received \$8.00 a month commencing April 16, 1870 and \$2.00 a month for each child as follows:

Charles Samuel born Jan. 7, 1855, 16 years on Jan 6, 1871,
Francis William born April 19, 1857, 16 years on April 18, 1873
Almeda Lodoska born April 10, 1859, 16 years on April 9, 1875
Benjamin Theadore born June 9, 1864, 16 years on June 8, 1880
Angeline Sivilie born January 21, 1867, 16 years on January 20, 1883
It took fifteen and a half years to receive her pension.

Julia A. Delaney was born at Paris, France March 7, 1826, and removed with her parents when about two years old to America, and resided first at Syracuse, NY, and afterwards at Stockholm in the same state. On May 7, 1844, she was married to Mr. Samuel Mason Tucker, and with him went to reside at Oswego, where their eldest child Maryetta was born. They then removed to Milwaukee, where five children were born, (see note 1.) Sarah Ann, George, Augustus, Augusta, and Charles. Then they removed to Prairie du Chien, where five children were born, Francis, Almeda, John, Benjamin and Angeline. They removed again to Monroe County, WI and later to Mauston. The last three years she has lived with her son, Benjamin, near New Lisbon, where she fell asleep in Jesus on the morning of Nov. 18, 1904, aged 78 years 8 months and 11 days. Her husband served as a soldier in the Civil War 3 years and six months in Company A 31st Regiment, Wisconsin Volunteers and (see note 2.) died July 29, 1865. Six children preceded her in death and five remain to mourn, George of Phillipsburg, Kansas; Charles of Nekoosa, WI; Benjamin, of New Lisbon; Francis of Oregon; Angeline, of Oklahoma.

Funeral services were conducted at her late home by the pastor of the Baptist church at New Lisbon, and she was laid to rest at the beautiful cemetery at Mauston as the sun was sinking in the west, on Sunday evening Nov. 20, 1904

Note 1: Samuel, Julia, Maryetta & George are listed on the 1850 NY Census, thus Sarah Ann & George were born in New York. Sarah Ann also died in NY. Possibly, Augustus and Augusta were also born and died in NY. The Tucker family was not found in the 1855 NY Oswego County census.

Note 2 : The date listed for Samuel's death was his discharge from the Service during the Civil War because of being wounded Aug. 4, 1864. He died April 16, 1870 at the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers.

She married **Peter Ellis Fales**¹⁰ 27 Sep 1863 in Crawford Co., Wisconsin¹¹. He was born 09 Jul 1809 in Union, Knox Co., Maine, and died 16 Sep 1897 in Lenora, Norton Co., Kansas¹².

Marietta and Ellis Fales are listed in the town of Fredericksburg, Chickasaw Co., Iowa 1870 Fed. Census. Ellis. 55, farmer, b. NY, Marietta, 24, wife, b. NY, Sabrey, 14, b. WI (daughter of Electu, Ellis' 2nd wife), Emma, 12, b. WI (Ellis' daughter I presume?), Charles, 6, b. WI, Savilla, 5, b. Iowa, Rossetta 2, b. IA. Charles is listed with Ellis and Electu on the 1860 WI Marquette Co., Springfield census. Charles' mother is probably Electu. Note from KLW: I have been unable to find the 1880 Census listing the Fales family. I am currently trying to clarify several Rootsweb & FamilySearch posted records about Ellis & Marietta's children entered by other people.

The information on Rosetta, Amelia and Adelia was found in Jeff Timmons file on LDS FamilySearch.

The Juneau County Chronicle newspaper dated the week of February 6, 1899 ~ Are Among The Mourned ~ Mrs. Maryet Fales Pass Away ~ Mrs. M Fales ~ At the home of her mother Mrs. J. A. Tucker, in the town of Lindina, Monday, February 6, Mrs. Maryet Fales died. Funeral services conducted by Rev. Daniel Sprague will be held at Mrs. Tucker's home at 1 o'clock today. Mrs. Fales was born in Oswego, N.Y., January 9, 1845. With her family she came to this city many years ago, but for several years has resided in Oakland, Iowa. (note: Oakland is in Pottawattamie County) She leaves five children in Iowa, all grown up. Other family mourners are her mother and four brothers. The deceased was visiting her mother when her fatal illness came.

The 1900 Census lists John & Amelia were married 5 years, which would mean they were married in 1895. Cora is listed as 7 yrs. old, born in Aug. 1892? Another instance of error by census-taker or giver of information?

WI, daughter of Jabez Reynolds and Elizabeth Wilcox. She was born 20 Nov 1854 in Fitzville, Huron County, Ohio, and died 20 Jul 1887 in Long Island, KS. Obituary

George Henry Tucker was born in New York State on May 16, 1854, and died in the hospital at Phillipsburg, Kansas on February 27, 1907, being 52 years, 9 months, and 11 days old. (this may be in error, as his mother's pension papers list his birth as May 13, 1850).

When a small boy, his parents moved to Wisconsin. Here, as a young man, he obtained his education and learned his life's work, photography. In September 1879, he was joined in marriage to Anna R. Reynolds. Of this marriage was born four children, one a son in New York State, one a daughter, residing in Grand Island, Nebraska. Two other daughters died in infancy. In the fall of 1886, the Tuckers moved to Kansas and settled in Phillipsburg, which has been his home ever since. Here he opened a photograph gallery.

Mrs. Anna R. Tucker died July 20, 1887. On January 27, 1889, Mr. Tucker married Mary Churchhill. Eight children were born to them, six of whom are living. Two weeks preceding their marriage, both Mr. Tucker and his bride were baptized by Rev. Simmons, and united with the Baptist Church. He has been a constant member ever since. For some time he was secretary of the Sabbath School.

When the Spanish American War broke out, he helped enlist a company and was first lieutenant of the same. At the close of the war he was honorably mustered out. Coming home he at once collected enlisted, and for some time, drilled a company of state militia. He enjoyed all military service. Mr. Tucker belonged to the Odd Fellows, Modern Woodman, and Knights and Ladies of Security Lodges. In the last two orders he was a Charter Member. He was a loyal enthusiastic and efficient member in each of these lodges and he will be keenly missed from their midst. He was licensed embalmer. He had the touch of a nurse, and often times his services proved invaluable. Some two weeks ago he had an attack of the grippe. Scarcely had he recovered from this when his old complaint again appeared. So precarious was his condition that a delicate operation was deemed imperative. This proved successful, but the frame was so debilitated that he gradually sank under the load, which for years he had so patiently, heroically borne. The end came last Wednesday, February 27. Mr. Tucker was a loyal citizen, a good friend and neighbor. He did not make a loud show of his piety, but at heart he was a Christian. Often did he say, "I am not afraid to go". He leaves a sorrowing wife and her six children, besides two grown children by his first wife. May God of the fatherless and the Comforter of the widow, come to their assistance at this time. The funeral services were held at the Baptist Church at 2:00 o'clock last Thursday afternoon, conducted by Rev. E.F. Judson. The services at the cemetery were under the auspices of the Odd Fellows Lodge of this city.

Maggie Amanda TUCKER, only child of George and Amanda TUCKER, was born June 11, 1875, and passed away at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph NUTTALL on Feb 26, 1948 at the age of 72 years, 8 months and 15 days.

When she was one year old her mother passed away. She was taken into the home of her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Allen BUTTERFIELD, near Oakdale where she also stayed until she had completed her common school education. Later she attended Wilton high school.

On Oct 11, 1893, she was united in marriage to Charles D. RUSSELL. They settled on a farm near Mauston where they resided for over 50 years.

In May, 1944, Mr. and Mrs. Russell moved to the home of their son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Nuttall in the town of Lisbon, Mrs. Russell being an invalid. Mr. Russell died on June 6, 1944.

Mrs. Russell was lovingly and tenderly cared for by her daughter and son-in-law during the years she was invalid. Every desire was granted to make her burden lighter in the sunset days of her life. She was a splendid, interested citizen, well-liked by all who knew her. Along with the many duties of a housewife she had time to gather the young people of the community together for social activities and she willingly helped as a practical nurse in time of illness.

Spanish War Vet Dies In Hospital

Ill for the past two weeks in the US Veteran's Hospital at Batavia, NY Frank Tucker of 323 Clinton St. Lockport, NY, Constable and Veteran of the Spanish-American War, died there at 1:45 this morning. Mr. Tucker was a past commander of Lockport Camp 83, united Spanish War Veterans, one of the charter members and active in its affairs for many years.

He was born in Mauston, Wis. June 9, 1882 (see Note), serving with Co. D 9th Infantry during the Phillipine insurrection and with the China Relief Expedition. He was honorably discharged July 13, 1903.

On June 29, 1903 he married Miss Hattie Tagg of this city, who survives him. For many years Mr. Tucker was employed at the Lockport Engineering works and for the past several months at the Rialto Theater. Besides his wife he leaves 4 sons, William, Floyd, Franklin and Clayton, and 3 daughters, Mrs. Glenn Compton, Mrs. August Gawve and Mrs. John Drew, all of Lockport, 11 grandchildren, 3 sisters and 5 brothers.

Note: Frank always listed 1882 as his birth date. Since his sister Elva, was born Nov. 1882, we wondered about the right year for Frank. Mary Ellen found a census record for Kansas that said he was born 1879? Frank was the son of George Henry & Ruth Anna Reynolds Tucker.

Francis William Tucker wrote 3 letters in 1930 to his niece Elva (Tucker) Sciple. Copies were given to me (KLW) from Shirley Butcher, great granddaughter of George Henry & Anna Ruth (Reynolds) Tucker. The first letter dated July 25, 1930 is about Francis & his brother George H. Tucker and their family's trip to the West from WI in the late fall of 1886. George stopped his travels in Phillipsburg, KS. Francis continued on to Boise, ID, helped build a saw mill in the Blue Mountains of Eastern Oregon, Portland, OR, Aberdeen, WA and San Francisco, CA. The second letter describes his early life in Juneau Co., WI and the 3rd letter is a story about a deer hunt in WI. These very interesting letters indicate Francis had a flair for story telling. According to Francis' death (12-12-1931) record from Los Angeles, CA, he lived in Willowbrook about nine years and lived in California for 35 yrs. This information was given by his daughter Laura A. Town. Francis must have come to California sometime between 1890-1896.

Francis wrote about working on a sawmill in Oregon in his 1st letter.

Is there historical data for the Sawmill Basin in Baker Co., Oregon? A great uncle tells of hiring on with a company in Boise Idaho and building a big sawmill in the foothills of the Blue Mts in Eastern Oregon. He mentions the location was 12 miles from any settlement. A guess on the time frame would have been between 1886 and 1888.
